Non-Discrimination

Policy Statement

Section 1557 is the nondiscrimination law of the Affordable Care Act (ACA). Section 1557 builds upon longstanding nondiscrimination laws and provides civil rights protections by prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability. This is important to achieving the ACA's goals of expanding access to health care and coverage, eliminating barriers, and reducing health disparities.
